



This book will help you know more about your community and surrounding areas of your school. It will also provide you with lots of information to help you think of some great design ideas for improving your community!


Do you know what the communities around your school are called? Or how many parks and playgrounds do you have nearby? Or how you and your friends travel daily to your school? Let's find out!



What's my school community?




Your city has more than 200 neighborhoods called "communities" and your school is part of a group of communities located at the north-east side of the city. Each of those communities are different and have distinctive characteristics which makes them special and unique. The Meridian community (selected in blue in the map) is where your school is located.



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What's in the community?



Your school community is mainly surrounded by stores and industries with no parks or outdoor recreational areas nearby. This means that people generally spend a large part of their day in Meridian and travel daily there to work or study Compare that with Marlborough to the east, a community with many houses and some green spaces. 

How do you and your classmates travel daily to/from your school?



Do you know that 34% of your classmates are not using the school bus to travel to/from school? Would you like to know why? Turn the page!

Why would you and your classmates travel to/ from school mostly by car?

- 1. Distance to school
- 2. School buses are expensive
- 3. Convenience (e.g., school on route to work, bussing available)
- 4. Traffic Safety/ Danger on route
- 5. Personal Safety

6. Time constraints (e.g., bus pick-up time does not fit family schedule, do not have time to walk or cycle)

Do you know that walking or biking to your school can help you to concentrate better in your classes?

A recent Danish study found that students who cycled or walked to school, rather than traveling by car or public transportation, performed measurably better on tasks demanding concentration.


Walking or biking to your school is good for the environment!



The personal vehicle is the largest source of air pollution in the city. More students biking also means less cars on the road. This reduces traffic congestion and therefore reduces pollution around schools.
